Students of DPS Numaligarh showcase their scientific temper by way of creative projects, exhibitions held within the school and at state level competitions. This year four students participated in the CBSE Regional level Science Exhibition held at Guwahati with the theme 'Sustainable Development with Thrust on Water Conservation '. Two of the students Jasraaj Saikia and Abhinava Kalita of Class VIII were selected for the National level Competition held at Suncity School, Gurgaon from 15^a to 18^a Jan 2020. The students were escorted by mentor Dr. Sangeeta Bharali Datta. They developed 'A Smart Maneuvering Stick' under the sub theme: Future Transport and Communication'. The special device prepared by them would enable Visually challenged users by way of features based on GSM module, GPS module, RF modules. The objective and innovative way of showcasing their interest and use of technology to prepare such devices was well appreciated. A total of 600 select participants from all over the country took part in the National level competition. The few days of stay in the environment of science fair was an experience itself and also the highly motivating scientific atmosphere was a trigger factor to ignite the mind and achieve greater pursuits in future.



The same format was followed in the Junior school for classes I, II and III on 9 March 2020. A number of activities were conducted which included:- Drawing





The session focused on simple individual actions that can be taken to solve this global issue such as:-


Choose to reuse
