ATAL MARATHON 2020

ATL Marathon is a flagship competition for AIM where Atal Innovation Mission brings in a new theme every year for innovators under which young students carefully research, innovate and implement their innovations over a period of 6 months. These programs help students to express their ideas and also help their inner scientist to grow. Students also learn to collaborate as a team and make best use of resources available to them. It helps in finding innovative solutions to real world problems and also helps develop India's science and research sector. With an ambitious resolve to "Research, Ideate, Innovate, Implement - Mindful Innovation for the greater good", this year's Marathon theme was aligned with Atma Nirbhar Bharat. It was a national level challenge where schools identify community problems and find innovative problems to those problems. This year ATL marathon was based on 5 pillars- Economy, Infrastructure, System, Demography and Demand. All solutions needed to be backed up by research work and students were required to submit their solution in digital form.

Delhi Public School, Numaligarh has been participating in ATL innovative challenges and is excited to do such innovative works in the coming future. This time more than 25 teams participated from our school in ATL MARATHON-2020 comprising of students from classes VI to XI. Students started working on their ideas at the end of January and refined their projects for 2 months and submitted it in the month of March. This also allowed students to spend the lockdown in a creative and fruitful way. The teams worked on various ideas ranging from smart farming to ideas that help in encouraging participation of women in local businesses. A total of 4 teams from our ATL (Three teams from our school and one from Morangi Sishu Bhawan) came in Top 10 in the State Ranking.




WEBINAR ON WORLD SUICIDE PREVENTION DAY 2021

THEME – "Creating Hope through Action"

On 10th Sep 2021, Delhi Public School, Numaligarh organized a webinar for teachers on raising awareness of suicide in our communities and identifying where and how we can work together. The topic selected was 'Love You Zindagi' which means to love life. The resource person were Rashmi Kaman, School Counselor DPS, Numaligarh and Dr. Bandana Das, PGT (Psychology). The School Counselor gave the key notes on why observing Suicide Prevention Day is important like in every 40 sec someone dies by suicide and India having 3rd leading cause in suicide death. She discussed about social stigmas for seeking help from mental health professionals, how parents or adults prepare their ward for success but not for failure and its impact on them. She also discussed about practicing eight resilience like social connections, Mind fullness, emotional savouring, gratitude, reappraisal, exercise and good sleep. Dr. Bandana Das spoke about general warning signs of adolescent with suicidal tendency, how mental, physical and behavioural changes happens in them and how anyone using the measures of ACT i.e. Acknowledging, Caring and Telling (informing right person) can make differences in students' lives. The program was an interactive one with memorable activities to help everyone to understand the depth of the topic.





Byju's Discovery School Super League (DSSL), Season-4

The *Byju's Discovery School Super League (DSSL) Season 4* is considered to be India's favourite Science and Maths quiz contest. It is a critical thinking and aptitude-based quiz competition where students can go from representing their schools to representing their states in a nationally televised contest and win amazing prizes along the way. The final winners of DSSL can win *an all-expense-paid trip to NASA* and *cash prizes up to 10 lakhs*.

Students from Classes III-X are eligible to take part in this competition that is held in three rounds. In Delhi


PRE-VOCATIONAL SKILL ACTIVITIES IN SUKRITI






