The contingents included The Assam Police Equestrian Team, 47 Assam R&V Sqn NCC, Assam Valley School, Individual riders from Dibrugarh. and the hosts Delhi Public School, Numaligarh. Mr S. K. Barua, the President of the Equestrian of Assam in his opening remarks stated that the federation has been hosting this annual event with the dual aim of promoting the sport and identifying potential talent. The events in the championship included Dressage, Jumping and Tent Pegging for all the three age categories comprising of Children, Juniors and Seniors.

Day one saw all the children events. The gold for children jumping was jointly won by Ms. Shannia Riddi and Mr. Atreya Joy Das of the Assam Valley School. For the children dressage Rudrakshi Bharadwaj, Shannia Riddi and Dibakar Sinha won the gold, silver and bronze respectively. Mr. Atreya Joy Das of the Assam Valley School also won the Children Jumping Event. Junior Jumping was won by Mr. Karan N Gam of Assam Valley School, while the silver and bronze were taken by Ms. Astorebeni Choudhury and Ms. Babli Kanwar. In senior category Jumping Fault and out was won by Angad Singh Shekon on his horse Toofan, while Sidhanth Kabra won the silver for the NCC and the bronze went to Havildar M Rahman of Assam Police. Meanwhile the DPS school children put up an

impressive cultural programme of the opening ceremony graced, Shri Bhaskarjyoti Phukan, MD of NRL.

The second day began with the Junior Dressage, which was won by Mr. Karan N Gam, with second and third positions having gone to Ms. Astorebeni



Choudhury and Ms. Babli Kanwar. Top score jumping was the main attraction of the day with Nammier Ahmed bagging the Gold on Sea Biscuit, while the silver and bronze were taken by the much improved contingent of Assam Police, comprising of Nk. Rituparna Chetia and Havildar M Rahman astride Marcellito and Fantasy respectively. The day also saw the Children riders of DPS Numaligarh perform well at the Gymkhana events hosted to initiate young riders into the equestrian sport. Junior Hacks was won by Ms. Astorebeni Choudhury of the Army Public School astride Smart One, while Mr.

Andrew William Tom of DPS Numaligarh and Ms. Gaatha Todi of Sarla Birla Gyan Jyoti School were placed second and third respectively. The highlight of the day however, was the Open Show Jumping, where the team from the Dibrugarh Centre made a clean sweep with Mr. Nummeir Ahmed astride Rising Star, Mr. Angad Singh Sekhon astride Toofan and Mr. Nammeir Ahmed astride Sea Biscuit were placed first, second and third respectively.

The enthusiasm and fanfare was carried into the third day of the event, with the day starting with Open Dressage. Mr. Angad Singh Sekhon continued his winning run, and took away the top honours for the event. Mr Poona Munda won the silver astride Gandolf and Nummeir Ahmed astride Rising star. Open Dressage was followed by Junior Topscore, where the junior riders put up a spirited performance. Ms. Babli Kanwar of the Assam Valley School won the event. The lady riders of the state put their skills to test in the Ladies Hacks event, where Ms. Yashodhara Dutta won the first prize. The day and the Championships concluded with the Open Six Bar event. Mr. Nammeir Ahmed won the event having cleared a height of 1.30 metres.

The day concluded with the giving away of the General OP Malhotra Best Rider Trophy by the Chief Guest of the Closing Ceremony, Mr. P.J.P. Hanaman, IPS (Retd.), which was deservedly won by Mr. Angad Singh Sekhon of Team

Dibrugarh. Mr. Sekhon showcased the highest levels of skill and determination throughout the Championships. The technical conduct was over seen by Shri BK Dey Sawian, IPS (Retd.), assisted by Shri Anirban Saikia, Secretary General of the federation.

The championships were judged by a panel of eminent jury comprising of Shri S Ramakrishnan, IPS (Retd.), Col SS Alhawat, VSM, Dr Tek Chand DIG ITBP and Lt Col Rahul Dagar.
