Report on Residential Programme In Physics

Organised by The Delhi Public School Society, HRDC

20th – 22nd August 2025 | Classes XI–XII

Continuous professional development is the key to strengthening classroom teaching and nurturing a scientific outlook among students. With this vision, the Delhi Public School Society, HRDC, organised a three-day Residential Programme in Physics for teachers of Classes XI–XII from 20th to 22nd August 2025. Mr. Kumar Diuck Dev, Physics Teacher at Delhi Public School, Numaligarh, had the distinct privilege of participating in this highly enriching programme. The programme was inaugurated by Ms. Sandhya Awasthi and Ms. Kiran Seth with a warm welcome to all participants.

The sessions were conducted by eminent professors and resource persons on diverse areas of Physics and pedagogy. Dr. Naveen Gaur introduced Wave Motion through Desmos, while Ms. Jasmine Kaur engaged teachers in innovative classroom practices and inquiry-based experimental learning. Dr. Sanjay Kumar emphasized the importance of rotational motion in everyday life, and Dr. C.V. Krishnamurthy provided valuable insights into Fluid Mechanics.

The highlight of the programme was the lecture by Padma Shri awardee Dr. H.C. Verma, distinguished professor from IIT Kanpur, on Problem Solving in Physics. He inspired participants to integrate concepts across chapters, avoid shortcuts, build conceptual clarity, and encourage stress-free learning. His insightful words left a lasting

impression and motivated teachers to reimagine their approach to both problem-solving and classroom teaching.

The Valedictory Ceremony was graced by Chairman Shri B.K. Chaturvedi and Executive Director Ms. Sandhya Awasthi, who urged teachers to innovate and pursue lifelong professional growth.



CBSE Far East Zone Tennis Tournament 2025

The CBSE Far East Zone Tennis Tournament 2025 was hosted by Delhi Public School Numaligarh from 23 to 25 August 2025. The event welcomed 28 registered schools from Assam, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal, and Odisha and was conducted in line with CBSE sports norms under the supervision of CBSE Observer Mr. Ajay Basfor (Physical Education Teacher, Gurukul Grammar Sr. Sec. School, Guwahati) and the AITA-certified Chief Referee Mr. Joy Mukherjee. The competition spanned six age-category events across boys and girls: Under 14, Under 17, and Under 19.

Opening ceremony set a formal tone for the tournament on 23rd August with a march past, torch bearing ceremony, oath-taking ceremony, and the release of gas balloons to declare the tournament open. The opening ceremony was graced by Dr. Kajal Saikia, Sr. CGM HR and Legal, Numaligarh Refinery Ltd, Pro Vice Chairman of Delhi Public School, Numaligarh. The tournament proceeded to a robust schedule, featuring 29 ties on the first day, 28 ties on the second day, and six ties on the final day before transitioning to the closing ceremony.

Across the six categories, team participation reflected a wide representation: Under 14 Girls had 11 teams, Under 17 Boys 18 teams, Under 17 Girls 9 teams, Under 19 Boys 8 teams, and Under 19 Girls 6 teams. The culmination of the tournament saw qualification of several teams to represent the Far East Zone at the CBSE National Tennis Tournament,



to be held at Rishikul Vidyapeeth, Sonipat from 23 to 30 September 2025. The qualifiers are as follows: Under 14 Boys – Delhi Public School, Numaligarh and Delhi Public School, Nazira; Under 14 Girls – Delhi Public School, Guwahati and Vivekananda Kendra Vidyalaya, Golaghat; Under 17 Boys – Maria’s Public School, Guwahati and Delhi Public School, Guwahati; Under 17 Girls – KIIT International School, Bhubaneswar and Delhi Public School, Ruby Park, Kolkata; Under 19 Boys – Delhi Public School Joka and Maria’s Public School, Guwahati; Under 19 Girls – KIIT International School, Bhubaneswar and ODM Global School, Bhubaneswar.

The closing ceremony, held on 25 August 2025, featured the presentation of the final report by Organizing Secretary Virendra Singh Gosain, HOD of Sports at Delhi Public School Numaligarh, with Dr. Kajal Saikia again as the chief guest. The CBSE flag was lowered to officially declare the tournament closed. The organizing team extended their best wishes to all qualifiers for the CBSE National Tournament, highlighting the spirit of sportsmanship and excellence that characterized the event.

Awareness Programme on "POSH ACT 2013"

On September 17, 2025, Delhi Public School Numaligarh hosted a one-day session for fourth-grade school and hostel staff on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment Act of 2013. The purpose of this initiative was to promote Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal through the POSH Act of 2013. Principal Shri U.C. Harbola gave the workers an overview of the POSH ACT 2013 at the beginning of the workshop. Mrs. Rashmi Kaman, the school counselor, then went on to explain the awareness program in more depth.

This training covered sexual harassment, what constitutes harassment, how to file a complaint, and how to prevent sexual harassment. Employees are also made aware of the severe fines and repercussions that could result from breaking the POSH Act, along with legal assistance. It provided information on Delhi Public School Numaligarh's internal committee as well. Regardless of caste, creed, religion, or gender, it also discusses how to protect children in schools and how everyone should treat one another with decency. Thirty-five workers in all actively participated in the workshop.
