Objectives of the Workshop

- To encourage collaborative learning and professional dialogue among teachers

Wings of the Wilderness: Exploring the Avian Biodiversity of Assam

To foster environmental awareness and inspire students to appreciate the rich natural heritage of Assam, Delhi Public School, Numaligarh, in collaboration with Bishram Ghar, an Assamese non-profit organisation renowned for its "Wings of Assam" initiative promoting biodiversity conservation, nature education, and responsible wildlife tourism, organised a Biodiversity Workshop on the theme "Wings of the Wilderness: Exploring the Avian Biodiversity of Assam." The workshop offered students a unique opportunity to explore the fascinating world of birds and understand the importance of conserving biodiversity.

The programme was graced by Shri Sanjib K. Gohain Boruah, retired IAS officer and acclaimed wildlife photographer; Mr. Firoz Hussain, renowned ornithologist and founder of IDs of Indian Birds; Shri Pranab Kumar Talukdar, President of Bishram Ghar; Brigadier Surendra Prasad, retired Indian Army officer and Chief Operating Officer of Bishram Ghar NGO and Wings of Assam; and Mr. Vishal Goswami. The workshop featured a series of enlightening presentations that introduced students to Assam's remarkable avian diversity. They also emphasized the ecological importance of birds and the urgent need to conserve their habitats through sustainable and responsible environmental practices.
